Maths

We are going to be using the scheme 'White Rose' This scheme helps to develop children's reasoning skills. This term we are going to focus on fractions, decimals and percentages, measurement and geometry.

It is very important that the children know all of their times tables, squared and cubed numbers, so please practise these at home.

Computing– In Computing, the children will be carrying on designing their webpages and looking at how we communicate online.

Science

This term we will be learning about Evolution and Inheritance. We will be looking at how adaptions help animals survive, what fossils can tell us, how genetics work, why animals can look different to their parents and the work of Mary Anning. We will be doing lots of practical activities including creating our own fossils and dissecting the DNA of a banana.

As a school, we are starting a new spelling scheme and therefore the way we will be learning and assessing is going to slightly change. Each week, the spelling list will have a rule that they follow. Your child will be tested on the weeks spelling, before seeing them. They will then learn the rule and complete work in class, as well as having time to practise at school and home. The following week, they will then be tested on the same spellings again to see if there has been improvement. Also, inside your child's homework book there is a list of statutory year group words. Please look at these with your child, so they are familiarised with them, as these are the words we are expecting to see in their writing.
