Sports Premium

At Pear Tree Mead, we pride ourselves on the quality of our P.E. curriculum, the wealth of opportunities given to pupils to participate in competitive sports and games and the wide range of sporting activities offered in lessons and clubs. In March 2013, the Government determined to pay a 'ring-fenced sport premium' to all primary schools to enable each school to 'improve the quality and breadth of its PE and sporting provision'. The sum received by Pear Tree Mead for the academic year 2023-2024 was £19,550. The total spent on Sports during 2023/2024 is £9,606.31.

The 5 key indicators where improvements should be seen are:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The National Curriculum aims:

- Develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- Are physically active for sustained periods of time • Engage in competitive sports and activities
- Lead healthy, active lives.

The table below shows how the allocated funding for **2023-2024** was utilized and the impact expenditure has had on enhancing sporting provision in terms of learning outcomes, engagement, sporting success and pupil well-being.
