Sports Premium

At Pear Tree Mead, we pride ourselves on the quality of our P.E. curriculum, the wealth of opportunities given to pupils to participate in competitive sports and games and the wide range of sporting activities offered in lessons and clubs. In March 2013, the Government determined to pay a 'ring-fenced sport premium' to all primary schools to enable each school to 'improve the quality and breadth of its PE and sporting provision'. The sum received by Pear Tree Mead for the academic year 2023-2024 was £19,550. The total spent on Sports during 2023/2024 is £9,606.31.

The 5 key indicators where improvements should be seen are:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The National Curriculum aims:

- Develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- Are physically active for sustained periods of time Engage in competitive sports and activities
- Lead healthy, active lives.

The table below shows how the allocated funding for <u>2023-2024</u> was utilized and the impact expenditure has had on enhancing sporting provision in terms of learning outcomes, engagement, sporting success and pupil well-being.











Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:









- Platinum Sports Mark Awarded for the first time.
- More friendly matches and learning festivals were organized this year, providing opportunity. Due to the increase in intraschool competition, we have had occasions were B and C teams have taken part. These included events specifically for pupils with SEND and those identified as Gifted and Talented.
- New equipment has been purchased to teach sports.
- The majority of pupils and staff now have logoed PE tops that are in their house colours, making it easier for intra-school competitions.
- New equipment was purchased to allow safe PE teaching
- The Sports Reps' are taking an active role with leading sports days and helping set up equipment.
- An annual sports day was held, which involved the whole school. KS2 sports day was held in September, KS1, reception and nursery were held in the Summer term.
- Obtained KS1 sports award from Active Essex.
- Links with trust schools has helped increase intra-school competition and support for travel and tournaments.
- Achieved 'Good' accreditation is school travel plan.
- Held a summer splash for all children in the summer term.
- KS2 school swimming gala held in the spring term.
- Euros football tournament interhouse competition for KS2.

- Investment in sporting equipment to train for new tournaments
- Increase the use of the minibus, sharing resources with the other primary schools in the trust.
- Look at targeting students more efficiently. We are looking at doing this in 2 ways.
- Targeting those who are not participating in sports outside of school.
- Target those who are gifted and talented, pushing them to attend local clubs and creating those links, sporting financially if possible.
 - Introduce a new way of collecting evidence of subjects taught. Sports reps will be introduced to the new method of collecting evidence to help support staff. We will be using iPads to capture videos and pictures.
 - Increase Inter School Competitions
- Increase girl take up of sports.
- Support new teacher in his role of becoming the new PE subject when current one retires.
- Sports leader tops have been purchased to identify the sports leaders easily.
