

Reading

Enjoying books and reading stories from an early age is crucial in the development of children.

At least one or twice a week, please share and read a book with your child.

Talk to your child about the pictures and encourage your child to talk about what they can see.

Please bring your child's reading wallet to school every Friday, ready for their books to be changed.

Speaking & Listening

To encourage children's speaking and listening skills, ask your child questions and encourage them to use their words to express themselves. Sing Nursery Rhymes with your child and support them to follow along with the actions. Encourage your child to share a book with you and talk about the pictures.
